PIRATE LOCALES

Port Royal is located in Jamaica at the mouth of Kingston Harbor. Many English and Dutch privateers turned pirate and used the city as their main base during the heyday of the Caribbean pirates in the 17th century.

The **Jolly Roger** is any of various flags flown to identify a ship's crew as pirates. The flag most usually identified as the Jolly Roger today is the skull and crossbones.

Gallow's Point was actually located in Port Royal and welcomed many pirates to their death, including Charles Vane and Calico Jack.

Execution Dock is located on the Thames in the Wapping area of London. It was used for more than 400 years to hang pirates, smugglers and mutineers that had been sentenced to death by Admiralty courts.

The **Barbary Coast** is located in the coastal regions of what is now Morocco, Algeria, Tunisia and Libya. This area was plagued by the Barbary pirates and slave traders who attacked ships and coastal settlements in the area, capturing and trading slaves.

The **Crow's Nest**, as most people know, is the structure in the upper part of the mainmast of a ship that is used as a lookout point. The name comes from the fact that early navigation systems used on ships were actually crows (the ORIGINAL land-lubber!). When visibility was poor, a crow was released and it would invariably head straight toward land. The ship's navigator would plot a course "as the crow flies." The crow's cage was usually high in the main mast: hence the "crow's nest."

I don't think **Skeleton Island** exists anywhere except in the movies! But the name makes for a good Pirate Locale!

Treasure Island is actually a book written by Robert Louis Stevenson in the late 1800's. It's a tale of pirates and buried gold and is the root of modern stereotypical pirate lore including treasure chests, treasure maps with an "X" marking the spot and one-legged seamen with parrots on their shoulders.

There is a place called **Dead Man's Cove** in Newfoundland, but it has nothing to do with pirates. However, this is another cool sounding Pirate Locale!

Captain Hook's Nook is not a real place either, but we are all familiar with Captain Hook and his hatred of Peter Pan and fear of ticking crocodiles!

The Black Pearl is another name from fiction. This wonderfully fast ship with her distinctive black hull and sails was captained by Jack Sparrow (SIGH!) in *The Pirates of the Caribbean* movies.

Davy Jones' Locker is the bottom of the deep blue sea and signifies death to pirates, particularly death at sea.

A **Treasure Chest** is just what it sounds like...a chest full of treasure! Look around you...they're all over!

Pitcairn Island is located in the southern Pacific Ocean and is the home to the descendants of the mutineers from the *Bounty*. In the late 1700's, the mutineers and their Tahitian companions (6 men, 11 women and a baby) settled on Pitcairn Island and set fire to the *Bounty*, which is still visible underwater in Bounty Bay. HOW COOL IS THAT?!?!

Devil's Island is located off the coast of French Guiana. It was part of the notorious French penal colony in French Guiana until 1952 and was the setting of *Papillon* (both the book AND the movie), which is the story of Henri Charriere's numerous alleged escape attempts from the penal colony. Again, not a Pirate Locale, but a cool pirate name!

The Spanish Main is the mainland of the American continents enclosing the Caribbean Sea and Gulf of Mexico. This area was the point of departure for enormous wealth that was shipped back to Spain in the form of gold, silver, gems, spices, and other riches. Due to these riches, the Spanish Main was ripe territory for Pirates and Privateers.

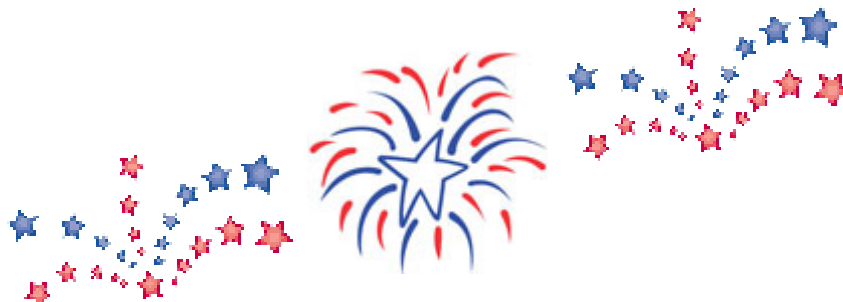

A Pirate's Lexicon

being a list of piratical & other related nautical terms.

Below is a list of over 40 words and phrases commonly used when discussing pirates or nautical themes.

1. **Arr! or Arrrh! or Arrgh!** – Aye or yes. A word made famous by Robert Newton in the 1950 production of *Treasure Island*. The word can be used as a verbal pause or to show excitement. (Think of it as universal "you know" or "alright!" in pirate lingo.) This one is pure Hollywood.
2. **Avast!** – The command to stop, or cease, in any operation.
3. **Aweigh** – The position of anchor as it is raised clear of the bottom.
4. **Under bare poles** – A ship without her sails set.
5. **Bilge Rat** – A scoundrel; similar to a scurvy dog.
6. **Black Jack** – A large leather jug for beer, etc., coated externally with tar often used by dockside pubs and taverns.
7. **Blagueur** – A liar. One who tells tall tales. Depending on the situation, a joker or a swindler. The term can be an insult or left-handed complement. Dates from 1883.
8. **Bloody** – In foul language, a vague epithet expressing anger, resentment or detestation (dates from 1785). As an intensive (a modifying word used to express importance or intensity, e.g. "That bloody blagueur") from about 1676. Considered crude language used only by the poor from 1676 to 1750. After 1750, more commonly accepted but still frowned upon in polite society.
9. **Boatswain or Bos'n** – The Warrant Officer in charge of sails, rigging, anchors and associated gear.
10. **Booty** – Plunder, gain, or profit acquired in common and destined to be divided among the winners. That which is taken from an enemy in war; the collective plunder or spoil. That which is captured by robbers or thieves. The term dates from as far back as 1474.
11. **Buccaneer** – 1. One who dries and smokes flesh on a boucan (not sure what this is...a fire or oven of some type, maybe?) after the manner of the Indians. The name was first given to the French hunters of St. Domingo, who prepared the flesh of the wild oxen and boars in

this way (from 1661, at least). 2. A name given to piratical rovers who formerly infested the Spanish coasts in America (from 1690, at least).

3. A name given to the Tampa Bay football team circa 1976.

12. Bumbo or Bumboo – An alcoholic drink comprised of rum, water, sugar, and nutmeg. An early recorded use is Tobias Smollett's *Adventures of Roderick Random* from 1747. Anecdotal evidence suggests it was used earlier.

13. Cap – A Dutch word for a pirate or privateer, typically Dutch, Hanseatic or Scottish.

14. The Devil's Jig – To hang.

15. Dogwatch – The watches from four to six and from six to eight in the evening. The watch from four to eight p.m. is divided into two half-watches (or dog-watches), one from four to six and the other from six to eight. By this means, they divide the twenty-four hours into seven watches instead of six, and thus shift the hours every night.

16. Gangway – The area of a ship's side where people board and disembark either voluntarily or involuntarily (as in *Walking the Plank*).

17. Gentleman of Adventure – A volunteer, privateer, or pirate. The term denotes a certain amount of sarcasm.

18. Gentleman of Fortune – A pirate or sometime privateer (again with the sarcasm).

19. Gibbet – A wooden frame from which dead pirates were hung, often in a metal cage especially fitted for the dead man (hanging in irons). This was done as a warning to others who would think of taking up a career in piracy.

20. Handsomely – To accomplish a task with skill and dexterity (dates from around 1551). Some sources say it is to do things quickly, but this was not the actual meaning.

21. Hearties or Me Hearties – One with Heart, a brave and loyal mate or sailor. "Me hearties": My brave and loyal crew or brave and loyal ship mate.

22. Jack Ketch or John Ketch – The Hangman (dates from around 1673, probably earlier). It remained a common term throughout the Golden Age. To "Cheat Jack Ketch" would be to escape hanging. To "Dance with Jack Ketch" is to be hanged.

23. Jack Tar – A familiar appellation for a common sailor (dates to 1781).

24. Jolly Dollars – These words were uttered by Long John Silver in *Treasure Island*. He is referring to the treasure buried on Skeleton Island. So jolly dollars are nothing more than pirate treasure. There doesn't seem to be any actual account of the words being used by pirates.

25. **Lubber** – A clumsy oaf. Thus a land lubber is a person who cannot adapt to sea life.
26. **Mate** – In the common sense, a friend or crew member in good terms.
27. **No Prey No Pay** – Crew received no wages, but shared in whatever loot was taken, a common contract for privateers.
28. **No Quarter Given** – A warning that if you resist, you will be killed. If you do not resist, your life will be spared.
29. **Picaroon** – 1. A pirate or privateer; also a thief or outlaw; a rogue or a scoundrel. 2. A small ship of a kind used by pirates; a small fishing boat.
30. **Pirate Round** – The route from America to Madagascar, up toward the Red Sea and then back to America.
31. **Scurvy Dog** – A foul person. May sometimes be used as a left handed compliment.
32. **Show Her Heels** – When a ship runs from a pursuer it is said to "show her heels".
33. **Strike Colours** – To surrender or lower your flag.
34. **Swabber or Swabbie** – One who behaves like a sailor of low rank; a low or unmannerly fellow; a term of contempt.
35. **Swashbuckler** – A swaggering bravo or ruffian; a noisy brag-gadocio (show-off). The term dates from as early as 1560. Think Errol Flynn in *Captain Blood*.
36. **Trader By Stealth** – A smuggler, especially one that does so in the cover of night.
37. **Tyburn** – The notorious place of public execution for Middlesex from as early as 1377 until 1783, situated at the junction of the present Oxford Street, Bayswater Road, and Edgware Road.
38. **Tyburn Saints** – Criminals who will one day be hanged (pirates, murderers, and highwaymen).
39. **Tyburn Stretch** – To be hanged.
40. **Tyburn Ticket** – To receive a sentence of death.
41. **Tyburn Tree** – The gallows.
42. **Wench** – A young woman or girl.
43. **X** – An inexact way of marking the proof of a bottle of alcohol. Each "X" represents 50 proof (proof being 1/2 of 1 percent). Thus, pure alcohol is 200 proof. A bottle marked "XX" would be 100 proof or 50% alcohol.
44. **X Marks The Spot** – The stuff of legends. Supposedly, pirate maps would have the spot of the treasure marked with an "X".
